

MODULE 1

October 31, 2024 10:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. ET Project Delivery Models

Conventional Project Delivery Models: The "Big Five"

Building on content covered in the primers *Understanding Indigenous Rights, Communities and Stewardship in Construction* and *Overview of Green Construction and Sustainability*, your Program Directors will kick off the program with a practical overview of the evolution of the Canadian construction industry and set the stage for you to maximize your experience in the program.

You will then engage in a detailed and practical analysis of the conventional project delivery and contracting "Big Five" models in common use in Canada. Discussion will include risk profile considerations and other determinants favouring each method in particular circumstances. Includes: Design-Bid-Build, Design-Build, Construction Management and EPC and EPCM models.

Public-Private Partnerships (P3) and Progressive Design-Build Models

Gain essential guidance on P3s and the evolving forms of alternative and progressive design-build arrangements used in Canada, including details of various transaction structures and the different risks, opportunities and strategic principles that distinguish each one from traditional delivery models.

Integrated Project Delivery (IPD) and Alliance Contracts

Faculty will review the core features, compensation structures, roles and duties of key participants in these 'collaborative' models including the common issues, misperceptions and differences, risk considerations and other determinants favouring each method in particular circumstances.

Practical Guide to Navigating the Construction Contract

Building on foundations reviewed in the *Key Terms in Construction Contracts* primer, you will learn about navigating your construction contract as a "rule book," including key directional points and pivots with expert insights, practical advice and risk management tools to avoid unexpected risk transfer, disputes and claims. This extended session includes drafting tips, sample clauses and best practices, and what to do if the contract seems to be against you.

Lean Construction

Advanced Issues in Procurement

Building on concepts in the *Bidding and Tendering Foundations* primer, you will delve into a detailed discussion of key developments, issues and emerging risks and challenges involving the procurement/bidding and tendering system. You'll review important legal cases and get practical strategies and tips for dealing with more complex elements under the tender process such as the evolution of the duty of fairness, privilege and discretion clauses, the correction of tender errors, conflicts, judicial review, and evolving rights and obligations.

Expert Panel: Key Construction Liens and Prompt Payment Developments

Building on the Overview of Construction Liens and Overview of Prompt Payment and Adjudication Regimes primers, a panel of national experts will take you through important case law updates and other developments driving where things are at. You'll review best practices for navigating pressing risks and emerging challenges, as well as practical information and risk management strategies for dealing with priority issues and complex challenges such as set-offs, correcting errors, trust claims, public land/works and intersections with other remedies/regimes.

Construction Claims: Legal Issues and Technical Issues

In a two-part series focused on demystifying construction claims, you will gain a practical overview of legal issues contributing to common claims and challenges, including extras, entitlement, change of scope and notice. You'll also learn important legal risk management and mitigation strategies when claims are unavoidable, along with considerations for key participants. You will next examine the technical side of claims, including common issues behind productivity, delay and impact claims, and with quantifying the loss, critical path analysis, disruption and limitations. You will gain expert tips and strategies for dealing with disruption, methods of delay analysis, claims mitigation and calculating damages.

MODULE 4

November 5, 2024 10:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. ET Top 5 Elements You Need to Know in Key Areas of Law Impacting Construction

Construction Insurance

Learn about specialized insurance relevant to the construction process, including key principles and the different products available, risk assessment considerations, gaps and policy issues, common pitfalls and litigated exclusion, and insurance for differing project methods.

Surety Bonding

Faculty will cover the essential role of the surety in the construction process, including key principles and cross-country elements, main parties, typical bonds used, legal and practical aspects of asserting claims and defences, and crucial risk management tips in problematic situations.

Insolvency and Restructuring

Gain sightlines into the law, risk and key principles involving project insolvency, bankruptcy and restructuring. Learn practical strategies to deal with key risks, including: construction trusts, dealing with an insolvent party, containing risks and navigating dispute resolution proceedings.

CONCURRENT REGIONAL SESSIONS
